

CONSTITUTION

CANADIAN PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION SOCIETY

I. Organization and Purpose

The Canadian Philosophy of Education Society is a constituent body of the Canadian Association Foundations of Education, which is, itself, a constituent body of the Canadian Society for the Study of Education. The main purpose of the Canadian Philosophy of Education Society is to establish and maintain communication in Canada among those interested in the philosophical aspects of education, to provide a forum of discussion and to encourage studies, research and teaching in philosophy of education.

II. Membership

All persons interested in philosophy of education, in any of its aspects, shall be eligible for membership provided they are to become members of the Canadian Association Foundations of Education and the Canadian Society for the Study of Education.

III. Officers

The following officers shall constitute the Executive of the Society:

1. President—elected biennially at the regular business meeting of the society.
2. Secretary-Treasurer—elected biennially at the regular business meeting of the society.
3. Program Director—elected annually at the regular business meeting of the society.

Nominations shall be received at the regular business meeting of the society.

IV. Meetings

The meetings of the Society shall be held during the annual conference of the Canadian Society for the Study of Education and shall be organized in conjunction with the meetings of the Canadian Association Foundations of Education. The regular business meeting shall be held also at that time.

V. Publications

The Executive shall be responsible for facilitating communication among members of the Society through the publication of a newsletter or other means that it deems appropriate.

VI. Local Chapters

Members of the Society who wish to encourage the development of activities related to the purpose of the Society at the local or regional level may organize local chapters in the name of the Canadian Philosophy of Education Society. Members who wish to organize local chapters must inform the Executive of their intention, giving details of their plans, and assume full responsibility for the operation of the local chapter.

VII. Amendments to the Constitution

The Constitution may be amended at the regular business meeting of the Society by majority of the members present. The Executive or any member of the Society may initiate amendment.
